### **INSTRUCTIONS**

For first time use: Solar light needs to charge in full sunlight for 6 to 8 hours to allow the rechargeable battery to reach maximum capacity.

### **TROUBLESHOOTING**

If lamp does not light, remove battery, wipe both ends with a clean, dry cloth and replace battery. Check the battery to ensure that it is making secure contact with the terminals.

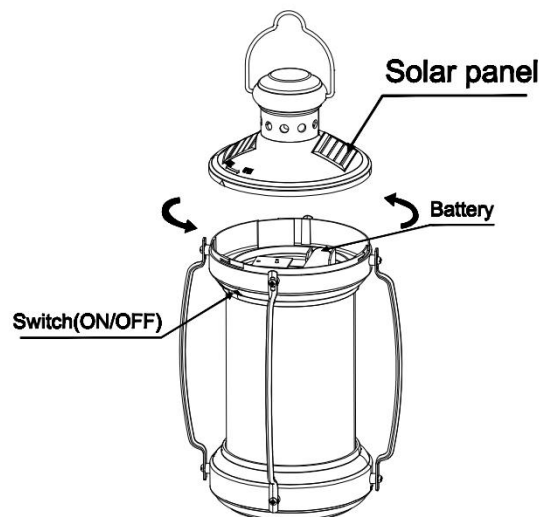
