



## Wool Rug

- **Vacuum Regularly:** Use a vacuum without a beater bar to avoid damaging the fibers.
- **Spot Clean Stains:** Mix a solution of cold water and mild detergent. Dab the solution onto stains with a clean cloth, but don't rub. Blot dry with another clean cloth.
- **Freshen Up:** Occasionally sprinkle baking soda on the rug, let it sit overnight, and then vacuum it up to remove odors.

## Silk Rug

- **Vacuum Gently:** Use a vacuum with a gentle suction setting without the beater bar.
- **Spot Clean Stains:** Blot spills immediately with a soft, dry cloth. For persistent stains, lightly dab with a cloth dampened with water and a drop of mild detergent, but avoid getting the rug too wet.
- **Avoid Water:** Silk fibers can be damaged by too much water, so it's important to keep the rug as dry as possible.

## Polypropylene Rug

- **Vacuum Often:** These rugs can handle regular vacuuming even with a beater bar.
- **Wash with Soap & Water:** Because polypropylene is synthetic and water-resistant, you can clean these rugs with soap and water. Use a mild detergent mixed with water, scrub with a brush, and rinse with a hose.
- **Dry Completely:** Make sure the rug is thoroughly dry before placing it back, to prevent mold and mildew growth. Polypropylene dries quickly, so this step usually doesn't take long.

## Jute Rug

- **Vacuum Regularly:** Vacuum both sides of the rug to remove dirt and debris.
- **Spot Clean Carefully:** Blot spills immediately with a clean, dry cloth. Use a very small amount of water if necessary, but dry the area fully afterwards to avoid watermarks.
- **Deodorize Naturally:** Sprinkle baking soda over the rug, let it sit overnight, and vacuum it up to eliminate odors.

## General Tips

- **Rotate Your Rugs:** Rotating your rugs every few months can help them wear evenly.
- **Avoid Harsh Chemicals:** Harsh chemicals can damage rug fibers, especially natural fibers like wool and silk.
- **Test Cleaning Solutions:** Always test any cleaning solution on a small, inconspicuous area of the rug first to check for colorfastness.
