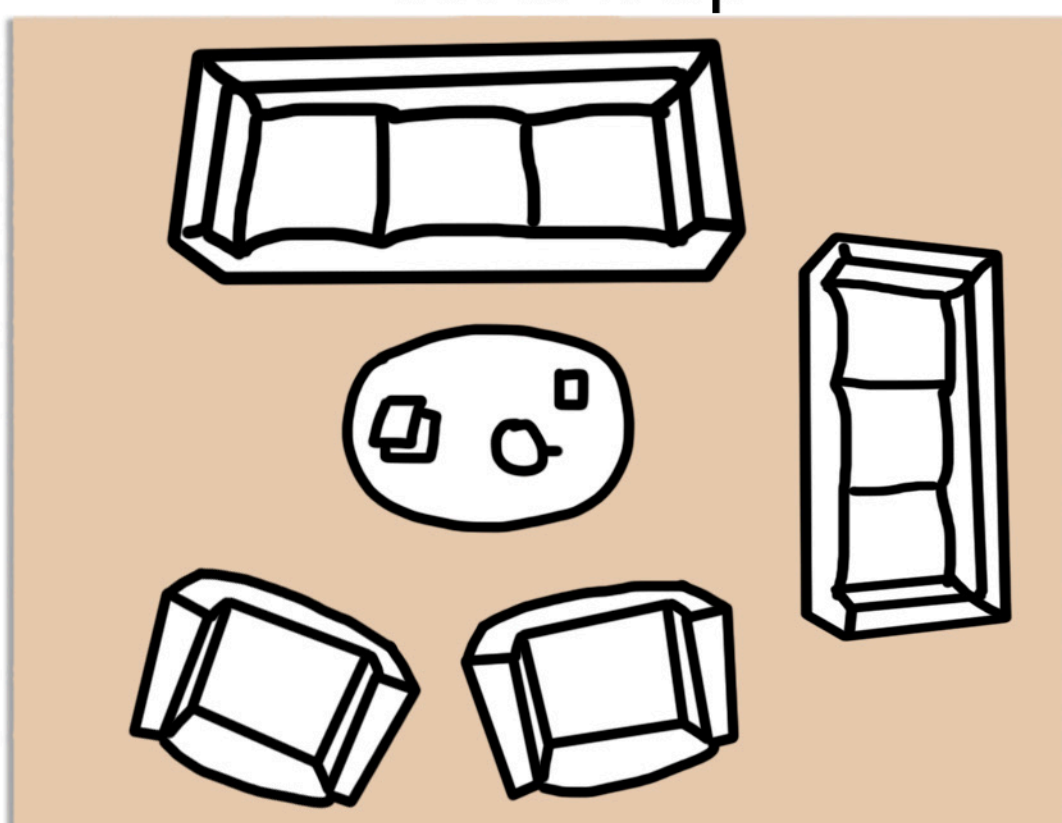


THE LIVING ROOM RUG GUIDE

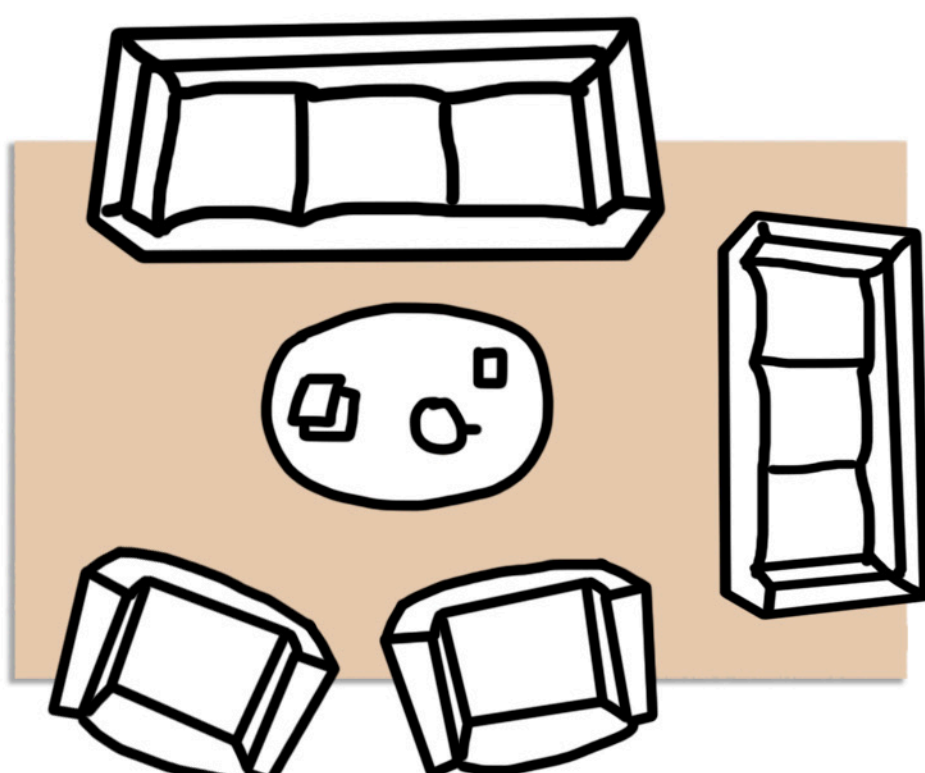
Big Space? Cover it up



For large rooms with furniture floating in the center, a rug should be big enough so that the furniture fits completely on top without feeling cramped.

Standard size: 9' x 12', 11' x 14'

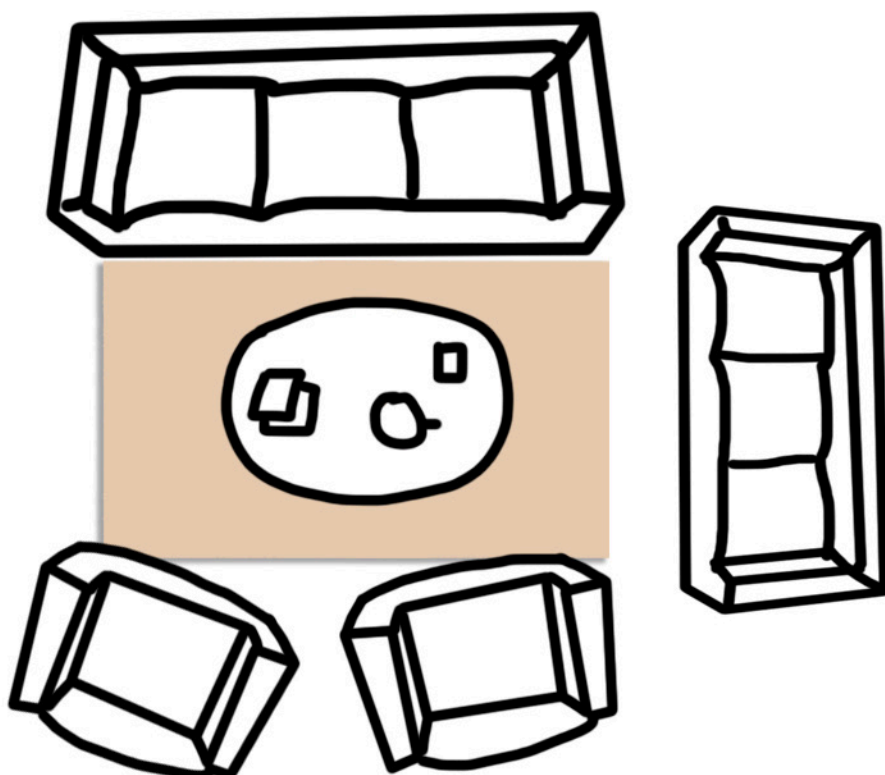
Furniture along the wall? Cover halfway



When furniture is against the wall, aim to have the front two legs of all furniture on the rug.

Standard size: 6' x 9', 8' x 10'

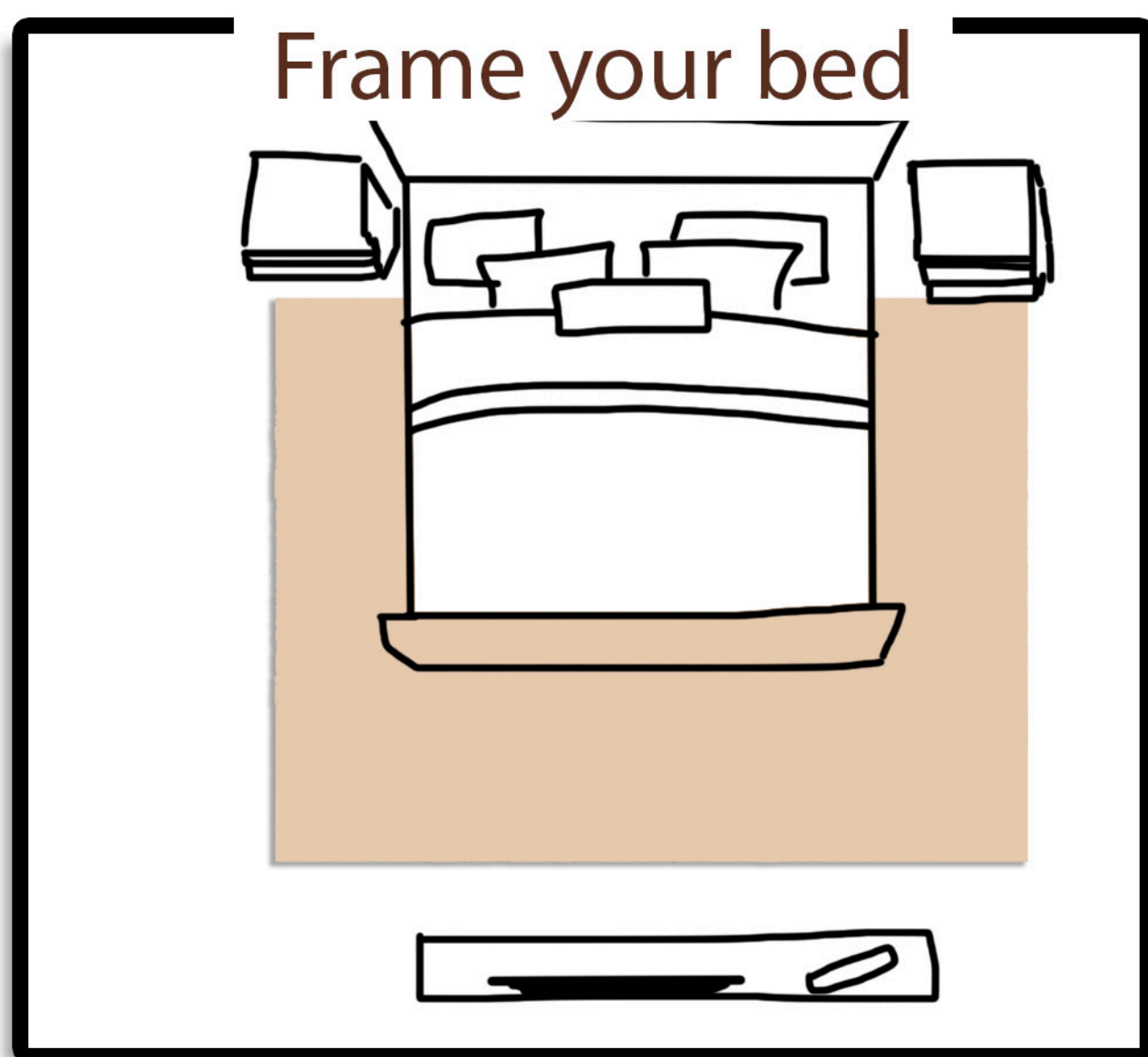
Small living room? Center it



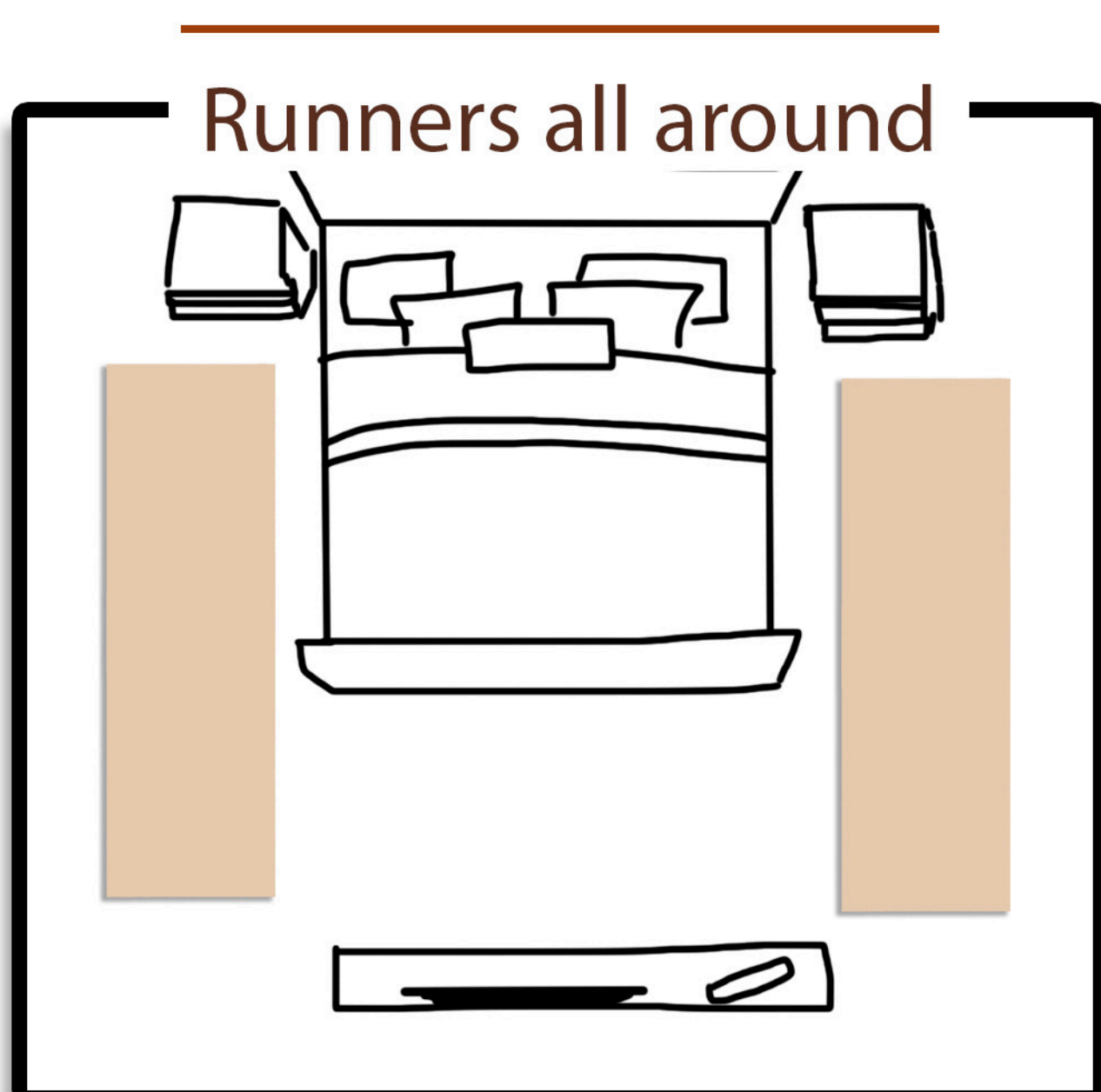
Smaller rugs can be used just under the coffee table or to define specific seating areas.

Standard size: 4' x 6', 5' x 7'

THE BEDROOM RUG GUIDE



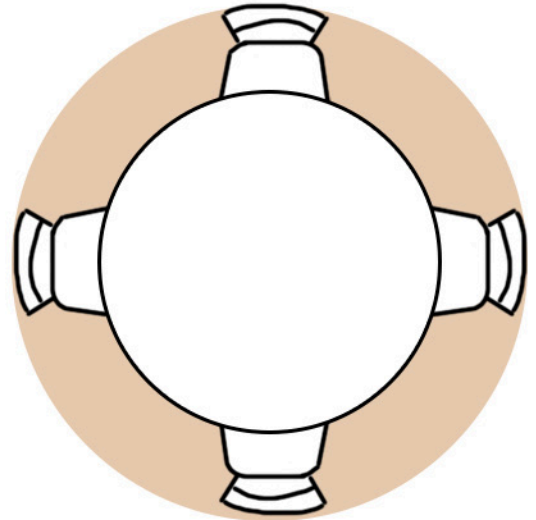
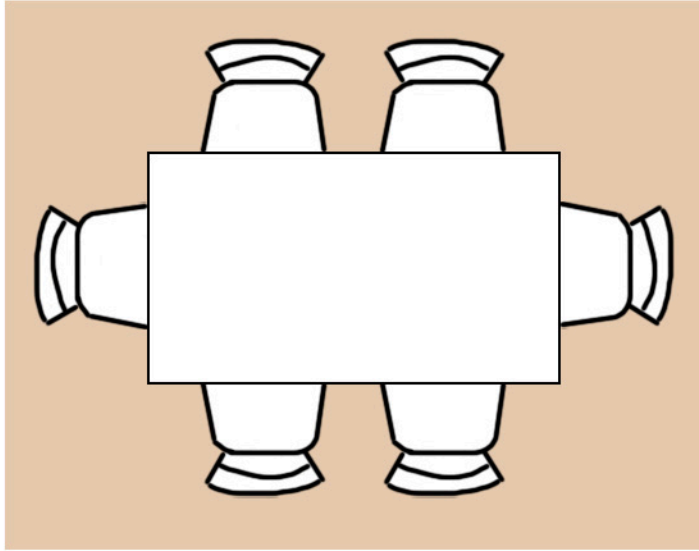
When laying down an area rug in your bedroom, it should extend 36" or so all around the bed. Alternatively, it could extend just on the sides, leaving the foot of the bed directly on the floor. **Standard sizes:** 8' x 10" (queen), 9' x 12' (king)



Runners are a great alternative to use on either side or along the foot of the bed. Even in a bedroom with wall-to-wall carpet, you can add runners on either side of the bed and across the foot for a cozier foundation. **Standard sizes:** 2'6" x 8', 3' x 5'

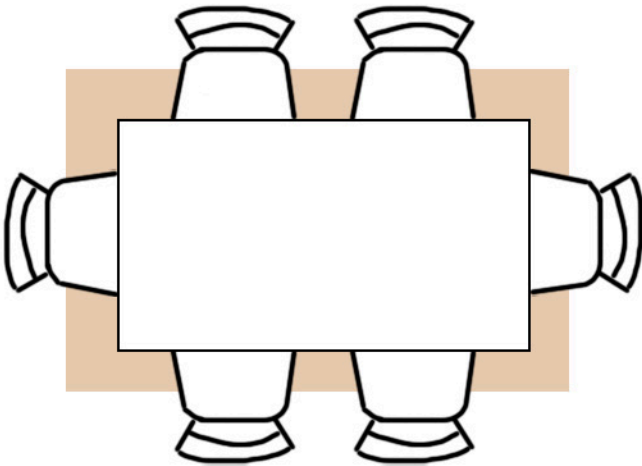

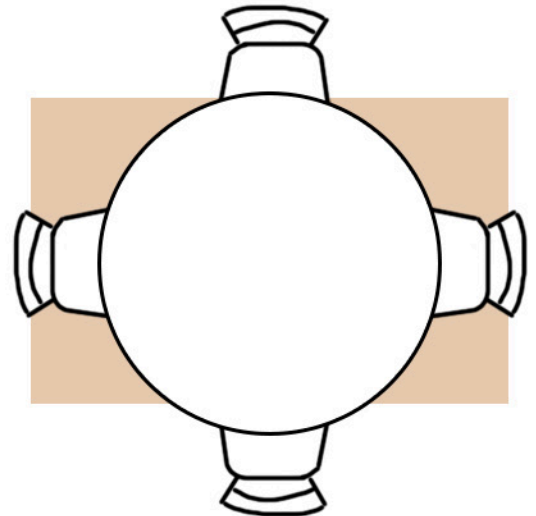


Matching shapes for the rug and dining table should have at least 24" of extra room on all sides

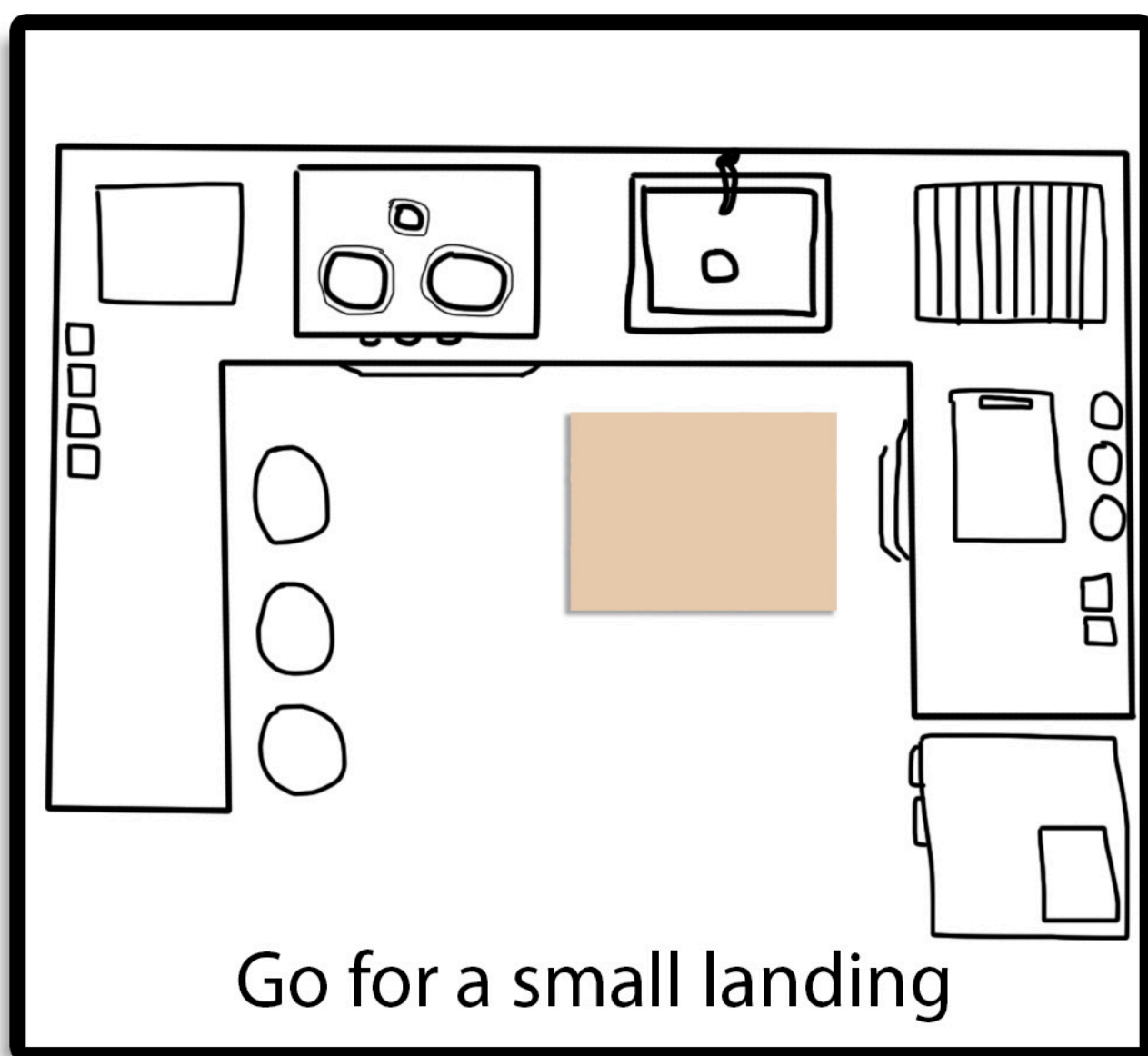


Rugs and tables with mismatched shapes

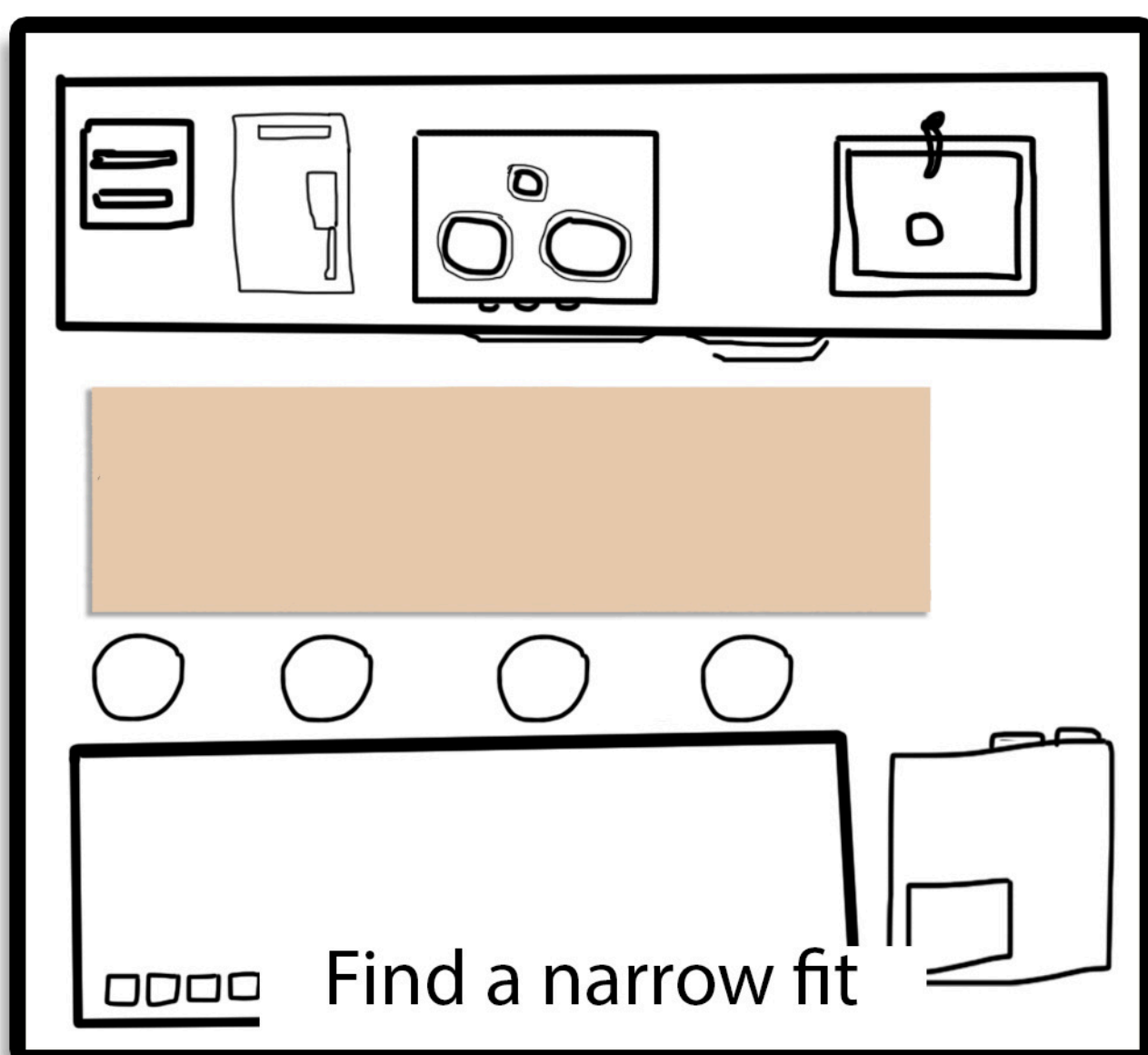
Standard Rug Sizes

THE KITCHEN RUG GUIDE



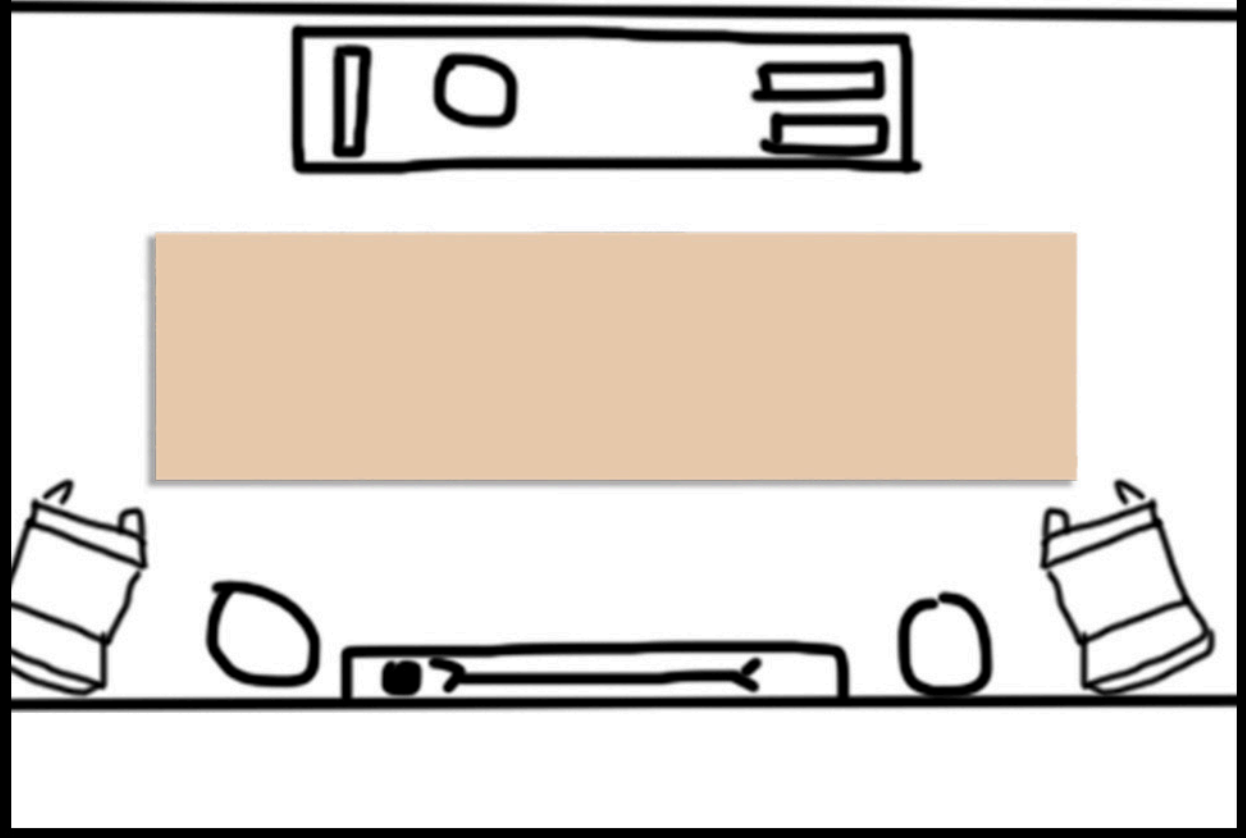
For the kitchen where there's lots of foot traffic,
a small, half-round or rectangular rug
in front of the sink works best.
Standard size: 2' x 3'



If you have a center island or a narrow galley kitchen,
runners that extend the length of the kitchen are a
great way to add padding underfoot and fill up the space.
Standard size: 2'6" x 8'3", 3' x 5'

THE HALLWAY RUG GUIDE

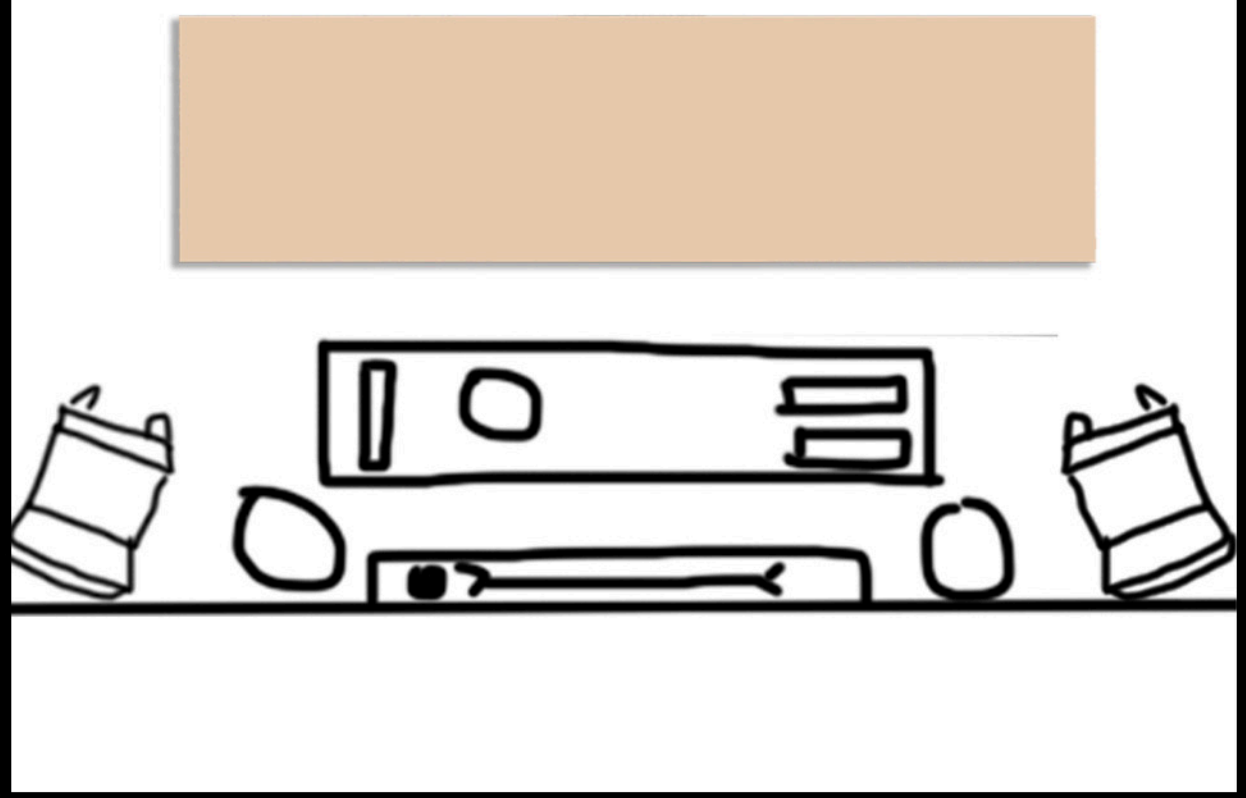
Flank with furniture



A long central runner can be used down the center of a hallway, with furniture pushed to the sides resting on the bare floor.

Standard sizes: 2'6" x 8'3", 3' x 12'

Keep It one sided



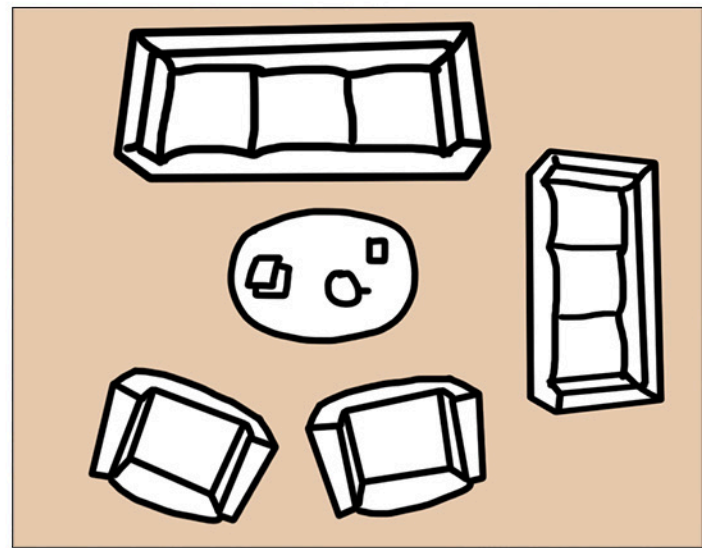
More common is to have a runner take up just one side in a hallway with furniture against the opposite wall.

Standard sizes: 2'6" x 8'3", 3' x 12'

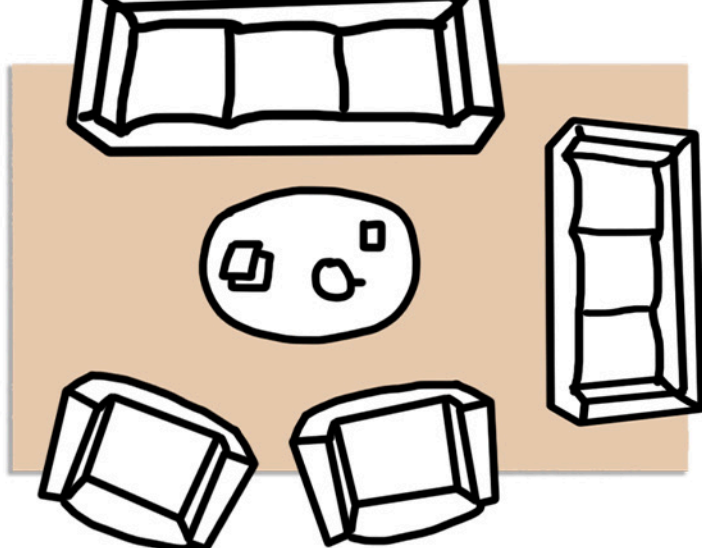

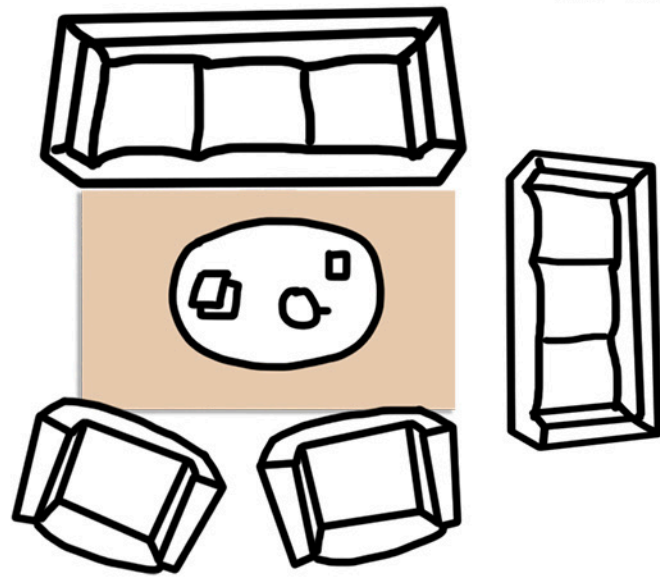


All Furniture pieces on the rug

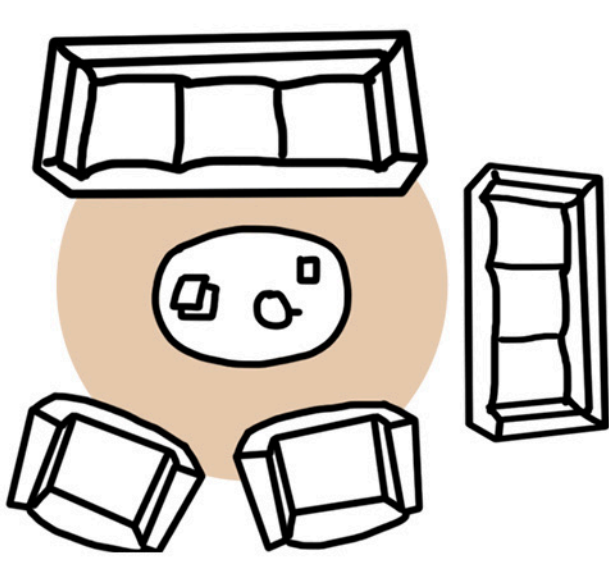


Front legs of furniture on the rug

Small rugs that only fits under the coffee table



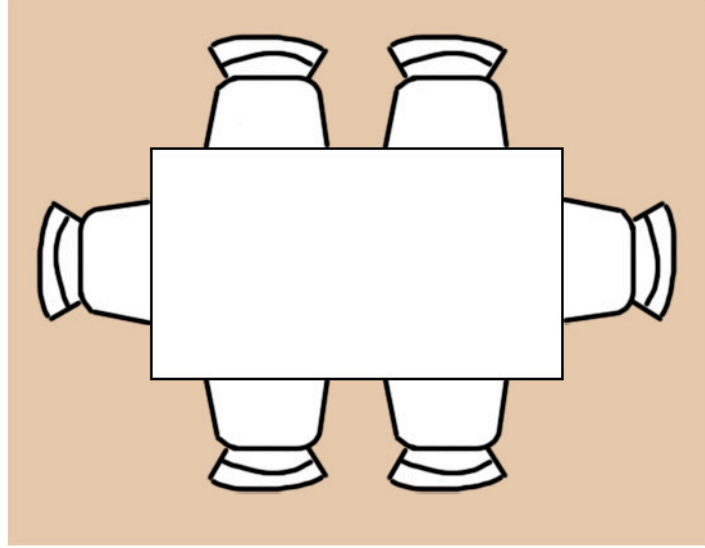
Circular rugs for the rectangular set-ups

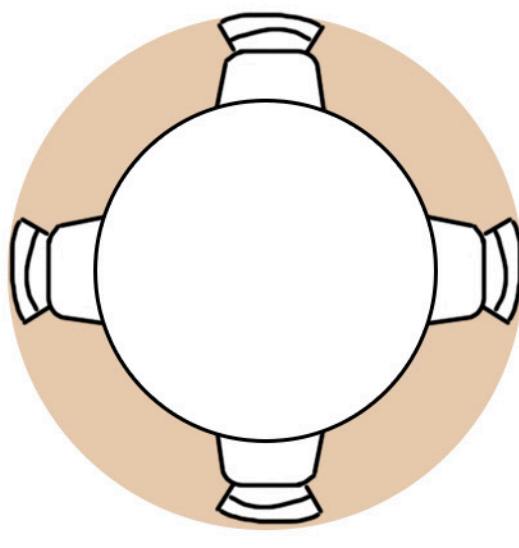

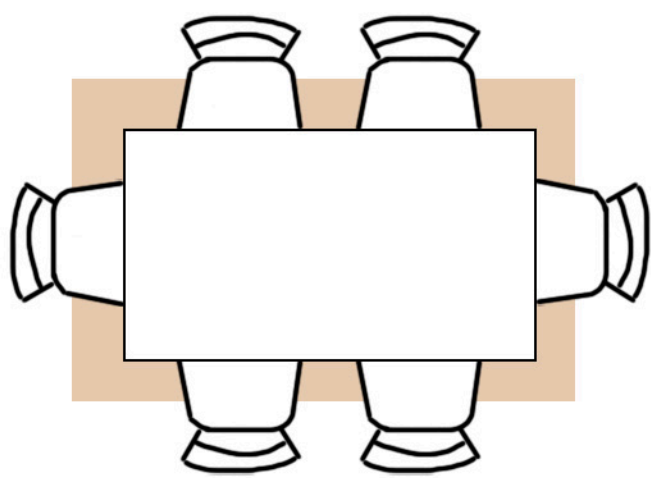

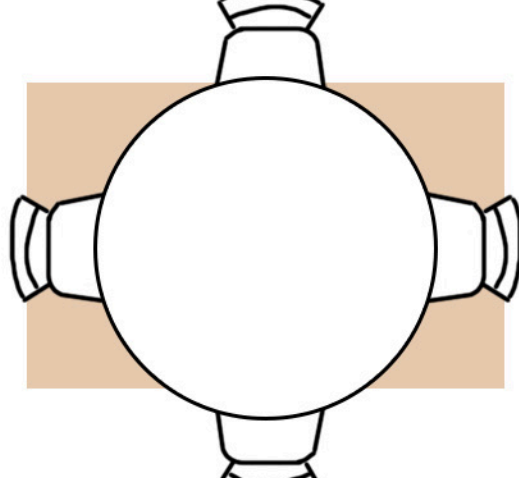

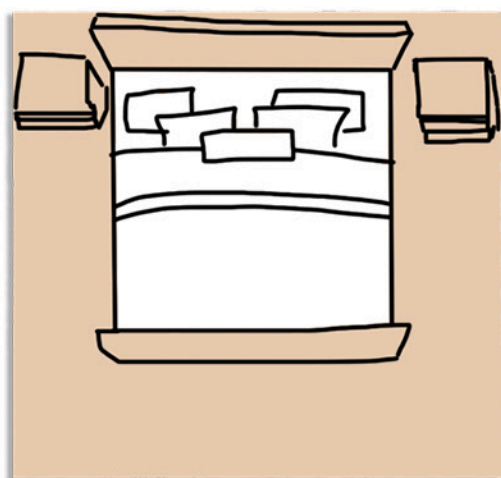

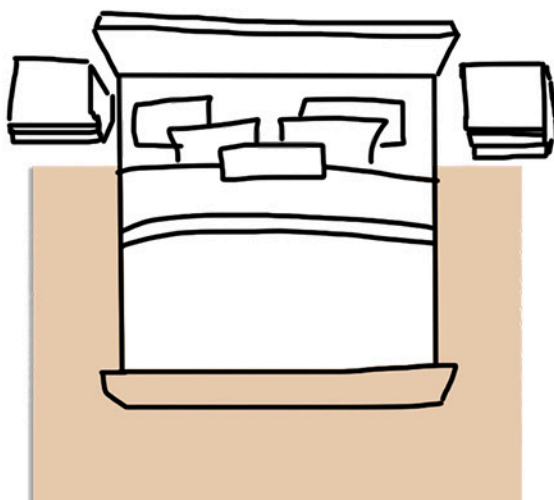

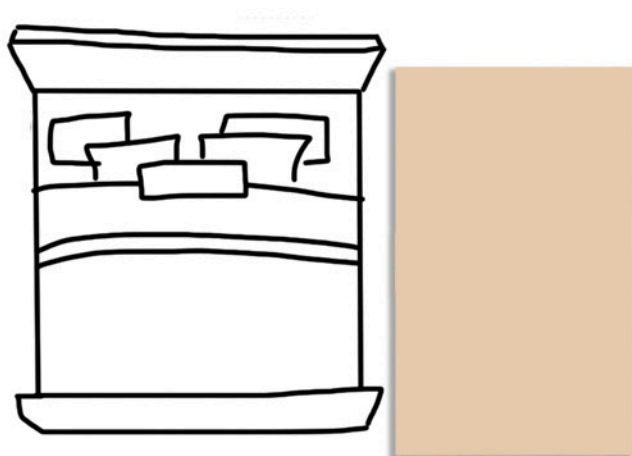
All furniture pieces on the rug



Only the bed on the rug

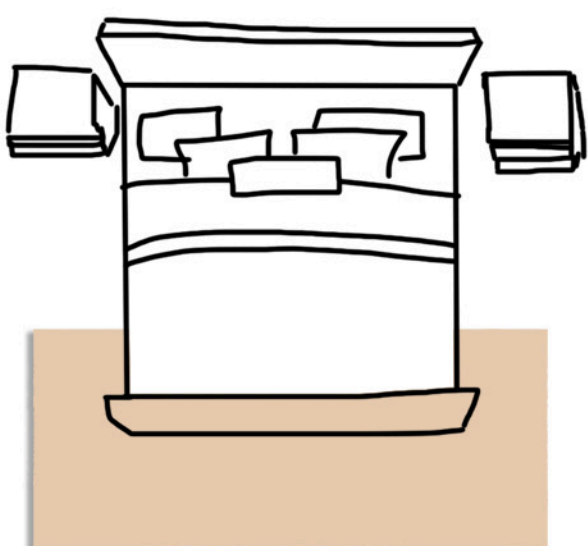


Rugs on either side of the bed

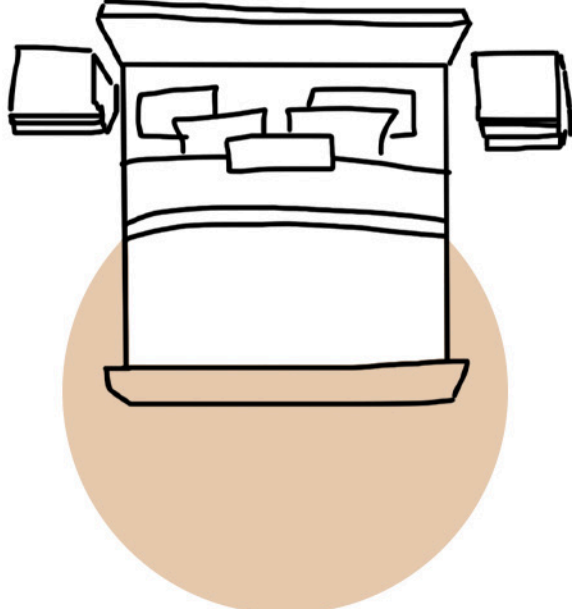


Rugs on the side of the bed (If your bed is against the wall)
