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Carrara Marble Care and Maintenance

Routine Cleaning: Use a diluted solution of mild, pH-neutral soap and warm water. Wipe clean with a microfiber cloth or soft sponge. Always avoid all acidic cleaners and substances.

Routine Care: Clean the surface at least once a month, using marble or stone cleaner, following the manufacturer's instructions.

Long-Term Care: Carrara marble is delicate and must be sealed frequently to protect it from spills and stains. Sealing the marble keeps moisture out of the naturally porous stone. We recommend sealing this marble at least once a year. You might want to seal Carrara marble twice yearly in heavily used areas.

Light Stains: To avoid stains, wipe up any spills immediately. Be especially quick about spills with alcohol or citrus. Immediately douse the area with warm, soapy water and rinse repeatedly to get rid of the stain and any soap residue.

Stubborn Stains:

Organic Stains (food, wine): Treat the area with a solution of 12% hydrogen peroxide with a few drops of ammonia. Wipe clean and rinse.

Oil Based Stains: (cosmetics, other oils) can be lifted using acetone or mineral spirits and rinsed away.

Ink Stains: Apply a small amount of bleach to lift the stain. Rinse the surface well and dry thoroughly.

General Precautions:

- · Keep the surface protected against sharp objects
- · Wipe up all spills with water and dry them as soon as possible
- Avoid contact with acidic substances and never use cleaning products that contain acid

Repairs

For water spots and light surface etching, use a dry, super fine, 0000-rated steel wool pad to buff out the blemish.

For deeper scratches and nicks, we recommend contacting a professional to re-polish the surface.
